




- 38 Towns in Ct. and Ma.

#### Long-term Conservation Goals:


 80,000 acres of new conservation land – which with current conservation land, would be 256,000 acres, or 33% of the region.












## Projected Forest Loss to Development




By 2030, 40 to 63% of forests in highly populated areas will be lost to development.





