





## Grassroots Tree Planting in Three Small Western Massachusetts Cities

- USFS Landscape Scale Restoration Grant (LSR)
- Plant 2400 trees in 3 cities over 3 years
- Develop planting plans for each city
- Develop network of tree care volunteers
